We are happy to announce (and welcome back) our **Keynote speakers**:



Brooke Schreiber, Associate Professor and the Director of First-Year Writing in the English Department of Baruch College. She holds a PhD in Applied Linguistics from Pennsylvania State University, an MA in English Language and Linguistics from the University of New Hampshire, and a BA from Stanford University. She has taught English in Russia, Serbia, and China, as well as in the United States. At Baruch, she teaches writing courses for multilingual students and linguistics courses focusing on the globalization of English, language and social media, grammar for writers, and New York City Englishes.

Her research focuses on second language writing pedagogy, translingualism, and global Englishes, particularly in English as a foreign language (EFL) settings. Her work has appeared in the journals TESOL Quarterly, the Journal of Second Language Writing, the English Language Teaching Journal, Asian Englishes, Language Learning and Technology, Composition Studies, and Composition Forum, as well as several edited collections. She is co-editor of two books: Linguistic Justice on Campus: Pedagogy and Advocacy for Multilingual Writers (2022), and Writing on the Wall: Writing Education and Resistance to Isolationism (2023).





**Boban Arsenijević**, Professor of Slavic Linguistics at the Karl-Franzens-University of Graz, Institut für Slawistik. He is a linguist with research interests in the theoretical and experimental study of syntax, morphology, semantics, and the philosophy of language. His specific areas of interest include aspect and argument structure, dependent clauses, lexical categories, agreement, realizational morphology, pronouns, as well as the architecture of the language faculty and the evolution of language from a comparative cognitive science perspective. His primary empirical focus is on Slavic languages, but he also works on languages from other families and groups. He has led seven research projects in various fields of linguistics.

Following positions in Leiden, Amsterdam, Barcelona, Madrid, Niš, and Potsdam, he is now a professor of Slavic linguistics at the University of Graz.

**Proposals** are invited for individual (or co-authored) papers and workshops on theoretical or applied aspects of foreign language learning and teaching, including (but not limited to) teaching methodologies, developing all language skills as well as (intercultural) communicative competence, teaching literature, assessing language and culture, translation, teacher training and professional development, EMI and ESP, and language policies.

We encourage submissions that approach these topics from various perspectives; we also welcome presentations on topics from any other field or discipline related to or reflected in language and culture teaching.

We are devoted to promoting linguistic and cultural diversity but for practical reasons of communicating across languages, the official language of the conference is English. If your oral presentation is in any other language, please provide a PowerPoint presentation in English.

Each presentation will be allotted 20 minutes, 15 minutes for the presentation followed by 5 minutes for discussion.

Workshops will be organized as 45-minute sessions, and the number of participants will be limited by the workshop author(s).

### **Abstracts**

A 300-word abstract/workshop description should be uploaded **via the conference webpage** (https://tlcnis.weebly.com/proposals.html/), following the instructions given there. The information uploaded should include: the full name, title, affiliation and contact e-mail addresses of all the coauthors; paper title, up to 5 key words, and the abstract text.

## Registration
